

As a long-term employee of ESLC, and now, as the Executive Director with the limited tenure of a mere two months, my review of the information enclosed tells me the East Side Learning Center is coming through strong after COVID—its impacts on tutoring methods, the insecurity it has caused tutors, and our young student readers falling behind. As we braved these trials, never did the East Side Learning Center lose sight of its mission: "to unlock each child's potential through the foundation of reading."

The East Side Learning Center is populated with "givers" and "doers", whose faithfulness brings us to a time of potential growth and a positive vision serving even more kindergarten through grade three readers who are powered by a desire to read and take that power in their life as adult citizens.

To the "givers," a sincere thank you for your generosity through these uncertain times. Our partnerships with the School Sisters of Notre Dame, AARP Foundation Experience Corps, and AmeriCorps have held our financial foundations steady. 



THE POWER OF GROWTH

3rd Grade

- 64% met benchmark for fluency and/or accuracy
- 70% made accelerated growth in fluency and/or accuracy*

2nd Grade

- 66% met benchmark for fluency and/or accuracy
- 52% made accelerated growth in fluency and/or accuracy*

1st Grade

- 97% know 26 upper and lower case letter names; 45% know 33 letter sounds; 91% made progress on high frequency word acquisition.
- 32% met benchmark for fluency and/or accuracy
- 37% made accelerated growth in fluency and/or accuracy*

Kindergarten

• 65% know 26 upper case letter names; 58% know 26 lower case letter names; 52% know 26 or more letter sounds; 94% made progress on high frequency word acquisition.

SEL

• 76% of students demonstrated social emotional growth based on the Panorama Assessment of Social-Emotional Growth.

*Based on expected fluency growth, % expected fluency growth, expected accuracy growth, and/or % expected accuracy growth.




