Reflecting on the past year, the impact of East Side Learning Center is unmistakable...

Dear ESLC Partners,

According to the August 2024 Minnesota Report Card, only 37.4% of St. Paul Public School students met reading achievement levels—reminding us just how essential our work is. Thanks to 9,500 hours of dedicated volunteer service, East Side Learning Center provided15,500 one-on-one tutoring sessions for over 220 children during the 2024–2025 school year.

Together, we supported students at St. Paul Music Academy, Frost Lake Elementary, East African Elementary Magnet School, and through two after-school virtual cohorts. Our Summer Excel 2024 program brought reading to life through literacy tutoring, Reader's Theater, and Active Literacy Games enrichment—while families joined in for Reading is a Family Affair events, building skills and memories that continue at home.

Opening New Chapters: 2025-2026 and Beyond

The year ahead brings exciting growth—new staff, new partner schools, and one-on-one reading tutoring for at least 50 additional children. We're thrilled to expand our reach to Nokomis South in St. Paul and Lucy Craft Laney in Minneapolis, bringing the joy and confidence of reading to even more students.

This progress is made possible by our dedicated community—140 volunteer reading tutors, our skilled site coordinators, program and volunteer managers, committed administrative team, and steadfast partners including School Sisters of Notre Dame, AARP Experience Corps, Liberty Plaza, and our school communities.


